The overall fund balance for Quarter 2 closed at £2.52m. Total income is £164k, comprising of real income of £145k, and unrealised investment gains of £19k. The 2-3 year dashboard shows our cash forecast for the end of this year is £456k and goes down to £229k the following year and £85k in the third year. This is dependent on the income we receive and our expenditure. | |

The work will commence at the end of January 2025. The Beacon Sensory Room – We have reached the target for this appeal. Flow Headsets - Following on a great success of the pilot of the headsets, we are working with the team to secure more headsets for further research work on suicide prevention. Self-care bags for LDA patients – These bags will enhance the experience of patients with autism or a learning disability by providing them with sensory focused items. These items aim to settle patients into the service. The bags will be delivered in January 2025. Mind Fit Event - Initiative has been launched and saw 18 business representatives signing up for our first networking event.
